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factors in the size of your group. You are the largest marching band to ever play London. Your hotel is located at Piccadilly Circus, the very centre (see what I did there, a wee bit of British English - the King's English - rather than American English) of London. So, the recommendations are made on the basis that you'll break into smaller, unstructured groups of your own choosing - go with your "mates" - rather than 280 Vols all at once... which could cause chaos!



uses our local knowledge. Often, the **most efficient & effective** way to travel around London is on public transport (on the London Underground, known as **"the Tube**", on the iconic red buses or by walking). We've also added in the Thames Clippers and cable car.



"London Vols Assemble": a hard requirement for you to be at the specified location at the time required.

Day 1 - Tuesday 27th June

T-minus 1 day Cheerio Knoxville... and Go Vols!

Tuesday Welcome to London!

- All travellers even the black suits will need to clear UK immigration.
 The UK Border Force allows all US citizens to use the automated e-gates
 how nice! Once admitted into the country, you will need to collect all of your luggage and band equipment from the baggage reclaim. Then, walk through His Majesty's Revenue & Customs (Nothing to Declare / the GREEN channel) into the airport Arrivals Hall.
- am Your London Band Week Liaison Officers will be ready to meet & greet you in the main Arrivals Hall.
- As soon as your travel (flight) group is ready, the Liaison Officers will lead you on a short walk to the motor coaches. The Liaison Officers will accompany you on the onward journey into the center of London.
- The motor coaches will drop you off as close as possible to the Volunteers Bag Drop & Hotel. Here you'll also find a London Band Week Desk - staffed all day to assist you with any questions. Collect your London Band Week Welcome Pack, Participant Accreditation Pass, prepaid TfL travel card (Oyster) and Survival Guide. Use the facilities (restrooms) and leave all your luggage here until hotel check-in opens at 3:00pm.
- am London sightseeing (in small groups as desired), including a chance for a late breakfast (don't worry, the "Full English" can be an all day thing) or lunch. Using your Survival Guide, explore Piccadilly Circus (the statue of Eros and the famous infomercial wall), Leicester Square (pronounced "Lester", the theater district and where all the movie premiers take place), Trafalgar Square (Nelson's Column and the National Gallery) and Covent Garden (London's original flower market and home to the Royal Opera House). All these locations, and many more, are within easy walking distance of the Bag Drop & Hotel.
- From Head back to the Bag Drop in small groups as desired, collect your
 3:00pm luggage and follow directions from the Liaison Officers to the Volunteers' hotel accommodation.
- After Check-in & freshen-up. You'll be a little weary by now but keep going as long as you can. The longer you can stay awake the quicker you will adjust to British Summer Time (BST).
- 4:30pm London Vols Assemble! For the London Band Week Welcome Drink Reception (1 complimentary beverage) and maybe a speech... or two.
- 5.30pm London Band Week Dinner: Fish 'n' Chips (of course) take-away from "Poppies". The remainder of the evening is free to explore London in small groups as desired.





Day 2 - Wednesday 28th June

Morning London Band Week breakfast: at local eateries.

- Morning Depart the Volunteers' hotel accommodation for London sightseeing (small groups as desired). Exploration by foot: Admiralty Arch, down Whitehall to the Household Cavalry guards, across Horse Guards Parade and down the Mall to Buckingham Palace.
- 10:15am London Vols Assemble! Changing of the King's Guard at Buckingham Palace takes place at 11:00am - don't miss it! Refer to your Survival Guide for the best vantage points.
- After Unofficial group photo opportunity in front of Buckingham Palace.
- After In small groups walk through St. James's Park (one of London's Royal Parks) to Big Ben. Here you will also find Westminster Abbey,
 Downing Street, the statues of Sir Winston Churchill and Abraham Lincoln (and many others), and the Palace of Westminster.
- 1:30pm It's time to head underground onto the **Tube**. Departing from Westminster Station in small groups as desired, ride the District or Circle Lines to Tower Hill. You can use your pre-paid TfL travel card for this journey - just tap in and out of the stations.
- After An opportunity for lunch in small groups as desired at Tower Hill.
- 2:30pm London Vols Assemble! Entry into The Tower of London home to the Crown Jewels! Since 1078 The Tower been used at various times as a royal residence, a prison and an armory. It was here that Elizabeth I was imprisoned, Anne Boleyn was beheaded and Guy Fawkes was tortured.
- **4.30pm** Stroll to **St. Katharine's Dock** in small groups as desired London's only marina to enjoy the picturesque setting and hospitality venues.
- After Walk across Tower Bridge to Shad Thames. This Victorian warehouse district is one of London's most photogenic streets.
- After Depart London Bridge for Piccadilly Circus in small groups as desired. Using the Tube, ride the Jubilee Line from London Bridge Station to Waterloo Station, change there for the Bakerloo Line up to Piccadilly Circus. You can use your pre-paid TfL travel card for this journey - just tap in and out of the stations.
- After Arrive at Piccadilly Circus & you're back at the Volunteers' hotel accommodation.
- **6.30pm** The remainder of the evening is free to explore London in small groups as desired for dinner and/or rest at the Volunteers' hotel accommodation.





Day 3 - Thursday 29th June

Morning London Band Week breakfast: at local eateries.

- **6:45am** London Vols Assemble! Board the motor coaches and depart Windsor for Stonehenge, Wiltshire (pronounced "wilt-sheer").
- 9:10am Arrive at the World Heritage Site, Stonehenge. Enjoy the visitor center exhibition in small groups as desired with a complimentary app & audio guide (BYO phones & headphones), and the replica neolithic housing exhibits. It is your choice to either walk the 25 minutes to the stone monument or take the shuttle bus.
- **11:15am** London Vols Assemble! Board the motor coaches and depart Stonehenge for Royal Windsor, Berkshire (pronounced "Bark-sheer").
- 1.10pm Welcome to Windsor! In small groups as desired take a stroll through Windsor Great Park, embark on the iconic Long Walk, or "walk" Queen Charlotte Street (the shortest street in the United Kingdom). Time to enjoy lunch in small groups as desired.
- 1.30pm London Vols Assemble! Entry into Windsor Castle & St. George's Chapel. Founded by William the Conqueror in the 11th century, Windsor Castle has since been the home of 40 monarchs. It is the largest occupied castle in the world. Today, you can enjoy the ultimate royal experience at the historic home of the British monarchy. In the grounds of Windsor Castle you can find St George's Chapel, a 500-year-old medieval marvel. Step inside the Chapel and you can glimpse where many royal weddings have taken place including HRH Princess Eugenie and Mr. Jack Brooksbank. It is also where many monarchs are buried including Henry VIII, Charles I and most recently, Queen Elizabeth II who rests alongside her husband, Prince Philip, and her parents, King George VI and the Queen Mother. Visit St. George's Chapel first.
- **4:00pm** London Vols Assemble! Board the motor coaches and depart Royal Windsor for Piccadilly Circus.
- **5:30pm** Arrive back at Piccadilly Circus. The remainder of the evening is free to explore London in small groups as desired for dinner and/or rest at the Volunteers' hotel accommodation.





Day 4 - Friday 30th June

Morning London Band Week breakfast: at local eateries.

- 8:30am Depart the Volunteers' hotel accommodation in small groups as desired for St. Paul's Cathedral. Walk along Regent Street to Oxford Circus Tube station, use the Central Line to St. Paul's. You can use your pre-paid TfL travel card for this journey - just tap in and out of the stations.
- 9:05am Arrive at St. Paul's Cathedral (exterior only) for a photo opportunity.
- 9:20am Walk across the River Thames (pronounced "tems") on the pedestrian only Millennium Bridge in small groups, to the South Bank.
- 9:40am Arrive at Tate Modern. The gallery offers free entry to the famous Turbine Hall.
- 10:20am Stroll along the South Bank to Borough Market in small groups as desired. Pass Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, the Golden Hind and Southwark Cathedral. Head towards the Shard, the tallest building in the United Kingdom - you can't miss it!
- 11:00am Arrive at Borough Market for an early lunch. The market began over 1,000 years ago when various traders took stall positions at the foot of London Bridge. From its current location since 1756, the market today shows that food can be made and sold in ways that are better for people, for the planet and for the sheer pleasure of eating.
- 11:45am Depart Borough Market for the Unicorn Theatre.
- 12:00pm London Vols Assemble! At the Unicorn Theatre to change into uniforms and collect instruments,
- 1:15pm Pride of the Southland Band plays Tower Bridge
- 2:15pm Walk back to the Unicorn Theatre to get changed and pack instruments.
- 3:15pm Depart London Bridge for Piccadilly Circus in small groups as desired. Using the tube, ride the Jubilee Line from London Bridge Station to Waterloo Station, change there for the Bakerloo Line up to Piccadilly Circus. You can use your pre-paid TFL travel card for this journey - just tap in and out of the stations.
- **4:00pm** Arrive back at the Volunteers' hotel accommodation.
- 5:15pm Leave hotel for Westminster Pier, it is a 20 minute walk.
- 5:45pm London Vols Assemble at Westminster Pier. All aboard the "Thames Pearl", the "S.S. Smokey" for the next 4 hours. The boat has one of the largest open-air decks on the River Thames. Dance the night away (to Sterl the Pearl's UK counterpart) on the cruise along the River Thames. London Band Week Bar (1 complimentary beverage) & dinner included.
- 10:00pm Disembark at Westminster Pier.
- **10:30pm** The remainder of the evening is free to explore London in small groups as desired and/or rest at the Volunteers' hotel accommodation.





Day 5 - Saturday 1st July

- Morning London Band Week breakfast: at local eateries.
- 8:30am Depart the Volunteers' hotel accommodation for the ExCel, Royal Victoria Dock in small groups as desired. Use the Bakerloo Line from Piccadilly Circus down to Embankment. Transfer from the tube to the pier and catch the Thames Clipper (a river boat service named Uber Boat) to North Greenwich Pier (The O2). From here, "fly" the IFS cable car service from North Greenwich over the River Thames to the Royal Victoria Dock.
- **10:00am** Arrive at the ExCel, Royal Victoria Dock. A short walk to the venue, the London Band Week Production Team will direct you.
- **10:45am London Vols Assemble!** Check-in and head to the band's private lounge for a day briefing from the London Tattoo Director.
- 11:00am Rehearsal with His Majesty's Royal Marines (Opening sequence)
- **Noon** Pride of the Southland, London Tattoo show rehearsal.
- **1:00pm** London Band Week lunch onsite in the ExCel boulevard.
- **3:30pm** Massed Bands arena rehearsals (Tattoo opening & closing segments).
- 4:30pm Massed Bands music rehearsals.
- After The London Tattoo cast photo call.
- **5:30pm** London Band Week dinner onsite in the ExCel boulevard.
- 7:00pm The London Tattoo live show.
- 9:00pm Strike site clear your private lounge, Transfer back to Piccadilly Circus using the Elizabeth Line tube. You can travel direct to Tottenham Court Road and walk 10 minutes to the hotel from there, or connect to the Northern Line and ride just 1 stop to Leicester Sq. and walk from there. Time wise there isn't much difference. You can use your pre-paid TfL travel card for this journey - just tap in and out of the stations.
- **9:40pm** Arrive back at Piccadilly Circus. The remainder of the evening is free to explore London in small groups as desired or rest at the Volunteers' hotel accommodation.





Day 6 - Sunday 2nd July

- Morning London Band Week breakfast: at local eateries.
- 8:40am London Vols Assemble! Board the motor coaches and depart the Volunteers hotel accommodation for London's Historic Royal Palace, Hampton Court.
- **10:00am** Arrive at Hampton Court Palace. A short walk through the palace grounds to the **private Garden Room** for event registration, equipment set-down and a briefing from the Parade Marshall.
- **11:00am** London Band Week: brown bag lunch in the Palace gardens.
- 12:20pm The Palace Parade Review and Drum Line London.
- 2.30pm Enjoy Hampton Court Palace in scatter groups. Experience the public dramas and private lives of Henry VIII, his wives and children in the world of the Tudor court. Admire Henry's Great Hall and Tudor kitchens. Discover the spectacular baroque palace built for William III and Mary II and explore Hampton Court Palace's outdoor spaces and 60 acres of magnificent gardens, including a 300 year old maze.
- After London Band Week Volunteers group photo call.
- 5:00pm London Vols Assemble! Board the motor coaches and depart Hampton Court Palace for the Volunteers' hotel accommodation.
- 6:15pm Arrive back at Piccadilly Circus into the hotel to freshen up!
- After Walk 10 minutes to Seven Dials Market, Covent Garden.
- 6:45pm London Vols Assemble! London Band Week Dinner at Seven Dials Market. Bringing you the taste and experience of London via 2 bars and 19 juicy independent market members. Banana Warehouse street food traders serving up cuisines from around the world & Cucumber Alley for tasty sweet and savoury traders. The market is open until 9.00pm.
- After The remainder of the evening is free to explore London in small groups as desired and/or rest at the Volunteers' hotel accommodation.





Day 7 - Monday 3rd July

Morning London Band Week breakfast: at local eateries.

Morning Preparations for hotel check-out and London departure.

- London Vols Assemble! Board the motor coaches and depart the am Volunteers' hotel accommodation for the airport.
- Your Liaison Officers will remain with you until you pass through am security and go air-side. They will stay onsite at the airport until the (final) flight departs.
- The Lead Liaison Officer will notify the Head of Operations, London am Band Week, of the final departure and communicate any outstanding traveler related issues to the Travel Desk. University of Tennessee-Knoxville.
